Through a cradle-to-career approach, United Way of Southwest Virginia is addressing the challenges facing tomorrow's workforce. United Way has aligned local support and investment from schools, businesses and government officials to invest in Southwest Virginia's youth - tomorrow's workforce. The Ignite program is bridging the gap and connecting schools and students in 19 different counties with employers and employees by providing internships to Southwest Virginia's youth. Students get a minimum of a four-week summer internship of 80+ hours spent on site and 2 hours of pre-employment training designed to develop workplace skills and competencies.
