We unite the community and mobilize resources so that every child, individual, and family thrives.


Vision

Importance of Your Support


ALICE, stands for Asset Limited Income Constrained Employed. The ALICE population represents those of us (men, women, and families) who work hard and earn more than the official Federal Poverty Level, but less than the basic cost of living.

The COVID-19 crisis has made the situation even worse for these families who are earning, spending, paying taxes, yet still struggling to make ends meet.
